Structures	Examples /expressing future
<p>will +infinitive:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-a.to make predictions based on personal opinion</li> <li>-b. to express a decision made at the moment of speaking</li> <li>-c.to make offers and promises</li> <li>-d. Polite requests</li> </ul>	<p>a.I think he will recover soon. The doctor thinks that the procedure will take about 20 minutes. The doctor knows that the procedure will be easy to perform.</p> <p>b.Are you free tomorrow afternoon? Ok. Then I'll see you tomorrow.</p> <p>c.It hurts. Then I'll give you an anesthetic. We'll send you an email.</p> <p><b>d. Will you open your eyes, please?</b></p>
<p><b>(be) going to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-a.to talk about intentions and plans.</li> <li>-b. make predictions based on present evidence.</li> <li>-c. premeditated decisions</li> <li>-d.future questions (pers. II)</li> </ul>	<p>a.She is going to apply for the position. I'm going to check your blood pressure immediately.</p> <p>b.Be careful! You are going to fall. The injection is going to hurt, isn't it? As scheduled the doctor is going to fill out the patient's medical record with all the details related to the procedure.</p> <p>c.<b>Are you going to see your doctor tomorrow?</b></p>
<p>the present continuous for future:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-plans/schedules or arrangement +future time expressions: next week, in three hours, later today</li> </ul>	<p>They are coming to see us tomorrow.</p> <p>I'm <b>seeing</b> my doctor tomorrow morning.</p>
<p><b>would like, plan, want, mean, hope, expect</b> to talk about the future</p>	<p>What are you going to do next year? I'd like to go to University and study medicine.</p>
